Dear Ms. Flynn:

This letter addresses two matters. First, it has been four weeks since I wrote you requesting that you provide me at your earliest convenience a listing of positions you have held with the federal government along with the dates that you held those positions. As I noted in my letter dated June 10, 1997, ordinarily a government official in your position would readily provide such information to any member of the public regardless of the reasons the member of the public sought the information. The failure promptly to provide the requested information merely suggests additional reason to believe that you were knowingly involved in a conspiracy to obstruct justice with regard to the matter described in my letter.

Second, among the materials I provided you on a diskette was a document identified as DOJ:\95-05-25.AJM, which was supposed to be a copy of a May 25, 1997 letter to the Honorable Abner J. Mikva. The document on the diskette, however, was an incomplete draft of that letter. A hard copy of the letter to Judge Mikva is enclosed.
